Society)</i> He had spent several past winters in Biloxi, and the summers here. He was always present at the Decoration Day Exercises, but unable to attend the last one on account of health. He was quite an interesting character. In height, he measured 6 feet and 7 inches, and he often remarked, "Everybody has to look up to me." And then again in relating his experiences during the Civil War, he said that he rode a mule but you couldn't tell it as his feet dragged the ground. He was one of our early</p>

		settlers, coming here soon after the close of the war and settling on a farm southeast of this city. Here he remained until moving to town. He could related much of the early history of our city and he took great pride in doing so. The body was accompanied by his son, Noah, of Urbana, Ill. Interment in Eastland Cemetery in the concrete vault which was constructed by the deceased several years ago. Had 8 children with 1 <sup>st</sup> wife, all of whom are deceased except the youngest son, Noah, of Urbana. Mr. BREWER served his country during the Civil War with Co. D., 1st Alabama Cavalry. He was a member of the Grand Army of the Republic, of the B.P.O.E. of Champaign, and an ex-minister of the gospel of the Latter Day Saints.

ANNA &amp; Cornelia ( ) ANNA; Born: Oct. 28, 1893 in Chicago; Died: Nov. 13, 1918 from wounds in WWI battle in France <i>(Obituary in "The Kinmundy Express" - July 28, 1921)</i></p> <p>His mother died when he was 8, and he made his home with his grandparents in Kinmundy. He graduated from Kinmundy High School at the age of 16, and entered Wesleyan University and completed a 4 year law course in 3 years, graduating at the age of 20. He enlisted in June 1917, being first rejected on account of light weight, and a month later he enlisted and was accepted. At Camp Logan in Houston, Texas, he was made instructor due to his proficiency in the use of the rifle, but as his division was ordered overseas, he was granted permission to accompany them, even though the Dept. wished to retain him at Camp Logan. He landed in France in May 1918, and it was at the Battle of Argonne that he was mortally wounded by a gunshot and high explosives on Nov. 10, 1918. The day before Armistice, he was carried cheering his comrades on to victory, to a Hospital in France where he died Nov. 13. He was buried in France by his comrades on that same day. At the request of his father, the government of the USA has brought from overseas the remains of this soldier. The funeral was held at the home residence at Galena, Ill. on July 2, 1921. Burial was made with full military honors in Greenwood Cemetery.</p> <p>Son of George ANNA &amp; Cornelia (SEE) ANNA;</p>

Died: Oct. 16, 1962 at Odin nursing home; Last surviving member of a family of 10 children, 2 sons, 7 daughters, and a half-brother. These preceding her in death were Samuel, Nancy, Leander, and Virginia, having died in infancy and childhood, Addie Yates, Florence White, Cornelia Anna, Hattie See, and Henry William See. SEE, Harriet J. 1868 – 1942		Harriet Jane SEE; Obituary: HARRIETT SEE, daughter of Michael See and Nancy Jane Carrigan See, was born Aug. 2, 1868 on the farm where she was living when she died March 20, 1942. She united with the Baptist Church in 1889. She leaves 3 sisters: Mrs. Florence White of Colorado Springs, Colorado, Mrs. Addie Yates and Miss Clara See, both of Kinmundy; 1 nephew , Carl White of Hugo, Colorado; 1 niece, Mrs. R. Lowe of this city; 2 grandnephews, Carl Ford White of Colorado Springs, Colorado, and David Lowe of this city; 1 niece, Nancy Lowe also of Kinmundy. Hattie, as she was fondly called, was a member of a family of nine children. Two brothers and two sisters died in childhood. One sister, Mrs. Cornelia Anna died in 1901, leaving a son, George Herman Anna, who was a member of the A.E.F.in the first World War. He was killed in the Battle of Marchville in France on Nov. 10, 1918. He was sighted for gallantry on the field of battle.
